A NOTE FROM MRS. BONNETT

"O Give Thanks Unto the Lord for He is Good, for His Mercy Endureth Forever." Psalm 136:1

24 years ago ILCS celebrated Mrs. Duenckel serving here 25 years. Mr. Dallas Koffarnus spear headed that event. Mr. K., Mrs. Rogers-expecting Shelbi at the time, and I expecting Corban at the time, did a little skit for Mrs. Duenckel on the old stage in the gym. Mrs. Duenckel's 25 year celebration was at the end of my first year of ministry here at Immanuel. When Mr. Kopp approached me 3 years ago, as I was completing 25 years in total ministry (my 1st 3 at St. Peters Lutheran, St. Peter, IL) he said we are doing something for your 25 here. I was not excited about that idea, but Mr. Kopp persisted. (A testament to the leaders both Mr. Koffarnus and Mr. Kopp are!) This has been quite surreal and awkward knowing this was going to occur. I wondered how I should approach this in my mind. This is definitely not just my celebration, this is celebrating 25 of the 156 years of Immanuel Lutheran School "Feeding His Lambs." I hope I never forget the sign above Mrs. Duenckel's classroom door, "Jesus Teaches Here." Each year of ministry that sign rings more and more true. I cannot do it on my own. Immanuel Lutheran Church and School would not be here on its own. Immanuel means "God with Us." I remember once when Mr. K and I were visiting about Immanuel he shared with me that this place was special. He said it is full of sinners like any other place of ministry but in the end, when someone is down and out, Immanuel steps up-no matter what. He said he had never been called to a place quite like Immanuel. I know that there are many incredible places of ministry throughout the world and Praise God for that! Right now, I would like to list some history of God in action just in the 25 years God has called me to serve here at Immanuel. I have been so blessed to see so much growth...

- -My 1st year (1999-2000) 1st year of preschool, 1st year of Kindergarten, 1st year of 5&6 grade My 1st year was the year ILCS moved from 3 grades to 2. I taught Kindergarten in the AM and 5th grade came out of the 3-4-5 grade classroom and 6th grade came out of the 6-7-8 classroom in the afternoons.
- -The next year the 1st full day Kindergarten and 5&6 grades were their own classroom.
- -I have been blessed with 6 different principals at Immanuel
- -I have moved classrooms 6 times...

- -Witnessed countless Science Fair Projects rock it, beautiful Christmas Services,
- -Witnessed our Lights and Sound guy (Kevin Engelbrecht) do his magic for the Awesome Musicals,
- -Rolling pencils in Miss Lynn's office and Mrs. McDonald's classroom in the old white house,
- -Saw the old school building torn down,
- -New bathrooms in the gym before the remodel (Thank You Ralph and Irma Popp)
- -New gym floor and Gym remodel
- -Gym heating and cooling (What happened to really getting in shape in August for Volleyball?)
- -No more hauling wood
- -No more fueling the wood furnace in the gym
- (many of the current teachers did that and countless dads and grandpas, moms and grandmas)
- -Acres and acres of God's Earth for the children to learn in and play on (We get to see and smell cattle!)
- -A cemetery to learn to respect and appreciate
- -Witnessed a team of men and women not let a virus stop worship, just adapt (let's have it outside)
- -Witnessed many students for the 1st time in their lives, own-read and study God's Word
